Fire Safety Tips

- Install & maintain photoelectric smoke detectors throughout your home; at least one on each floor level, outside of bedroom areas, and inside each bedroom.
- Install carbon monoxide detectors near sleeping areas.
- Mount a minimum sized 1A10BC fire extinguisher near the kitchen area and know how to use it.
- Never leave anything cooking on the stovetop unattended.
- Extinguish a grease fire in a pan by covering it with the lid, skillet or cookie sheet.
- Keep combustibles at least 3 feet away from all heating equipment.
- Keep matches, lighters and candles out of children's reach.
- Extinguish candles when sleeping and when unattended.
- Never smoke in bed or when sleepy.
- Do not overload extension cords. Better yet, use a circuit breaker protected outlet strip.
- Do not place electrical cords under carpeting or run through doors or openings where they could become damaged from pinching or from being walked on.
- Have and practice a home fire escape plan.
- Crawl low in smoke and feel closed doors before opening them.
- Stop, drop and roll if your clothes or hair are on fire.
- Have a family meeting place outside & never reenter once out safely.
- Call 911 to report a fire or emergency.
